

## Individual Anti-Terrorism Plan (IATP) Guidance

Per the PACOM OPOD 5050-08 and the DoD Foreign Clearance Guide, U.S. Military, DoD Civilians, and/or Contractors traveling into or within the USPACOM AOR must enter their travel information into Individual Anti-Terrorism Plan (IATP). For U. S. PACOM assigned personnel, all travel worldwide must be entered. Exceptions: CONUS or to any U.S. Territories or Possessions. U.S. Military, DoD Civilians, and/or Contractors must complete an IATP at least 5-10 days prior to departure regardless if official or unofficial travel. Travelers should first check the Foreign Clearance Guide and USPACOM AOR Country threat matrix when planning a trip. Certain countries have travel restrictions, such as India, Indonesia, Nepal, Papua New Guinea, Sri Lanka and Mexico. These countries require an IATP to be completed and a General Officer approval prior to traveling. Countries such as Thailand and the Philippines are split restricted meaning certain areas of that particular country has travel restrictions.

For example: Mexico has a travel restriction. Non-official travel is prohibited in the following states: Michoacan, Tamaulipas, Sinaloa, Coahuila, Nuevo Leon, Chihuahua, Durango, San Luis Potosi, Zacatecas, Jalisco. All other areas not listed requires the first O-6 in your chain of command (on G-Series orders) approval prior to travel. If the traveler is taking a cruise and the ship will port in any of the off-limit locations, the traveler will not be permitted to leave the ship while in port. (If the trip is approved by an O-6 in his/her chain-of-command).

All travel to foreign locations requires a country brief. The brief is normally offered by AFOSI every Monday at 1000 hrs at Bldg 720. AFOSI may be reached at DSN 225-9881.

Travelers should also leave a trip itinerary, contact information, and dates of travel with family or friends. Additionally, they should carry the Embassy/Consult, police, ambulance with them at all times during their travel.

Travelers are strongly advised to enroll in the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP). STEP is a free service provided by the U.S. Government to U.S. citizens who are traveling to or living in a foreign country. STEP will help the Department of State contact the traveler if there is a family emergency in the U.S., or if there is a crisis where you are traveling.
