SUBJECT: Off-Limits Establishment Order

Releasability: There are no releasability restrictions on this publication

By Order of the Commander, 374th Airlift Wing, this is a Yokota Air Base Guidance Memorandum immediately implementing policy towards instituting off-limits establishments for all Yokota Air Base personnel. Compliance with this memorandum is mandatory. Paragraph 2 of this memo contains prohibitions enforceable against the individual. Failure to comply with the order articulated in paragraph 2 by all Yokota Air Base SOFA status members, SOFA status dependents, DoD civilians, and DoD-invited contractors can subject the violator to all forms of available punishment to include UCMJ action under Article 92, Failure to Obey Order or Regulation, and/or barment. To the extent its direction is inconsistent with other Air Force Publications, the information herein prevails, in accordance with AFI 33-360, *Publications and Forms Management*.

1. The installation commander is responsible for maintaining the good order and discipline of all service members and the health, safety, and welfare of all personnel on Yokota Air Base. I take this obligation seriously.
2. Investigation has shown that the below-listed establishments are engaged in the unlawful sale of controlled substances. I am issuing the following lawful order until further notice:

All Yokota Air Base personnel are prohibited from entering the following establishments:

- Rainbow Tribe (on Route 16 south of the Fussa Gate)
- Buzz Montage (on Route 16 north of the Fussa Gate)
- American Rush (straight out the Fussa Gate next to 7/11)

3. This order applies to all SOFA-status personnel, including military members, dependents, DoD civilians, and DoD-invited contractors. The above-listed establishments are not to be entered at all, regardless of the time of day or night. Additionally, a change in ownership, management, or name of the above-listed establishment will not revoke this order automatically.

4. Pursuant to Agreed View 6 to the Status of Forces Agreement, Yokota law enforcement agencies will notify Japanese police that these establishments are off limits for United States Armed Forces personnel, the civilian component (including contractors), and dependents.
5. This memorandum supersedes the previous policy letter, same subject dated 19 Sep 2011.

Ensure all records created as a result of processes prescribed in this memorandum are maintained in accordance with AF Manual (AFMAN) 33-363, *Management of Records*, and disposed of in accordance with the Air Force Records Disposition Schedule (RDS) located at <https://www.my.af.mil/afirms/afirms/afirms/rims.cfm>.

The policy in this memorandum becomes void after 180 days have elapsed from the date of this memorandum, or upon release of an AF publication incorporating the guidance, whichever is earlier.
