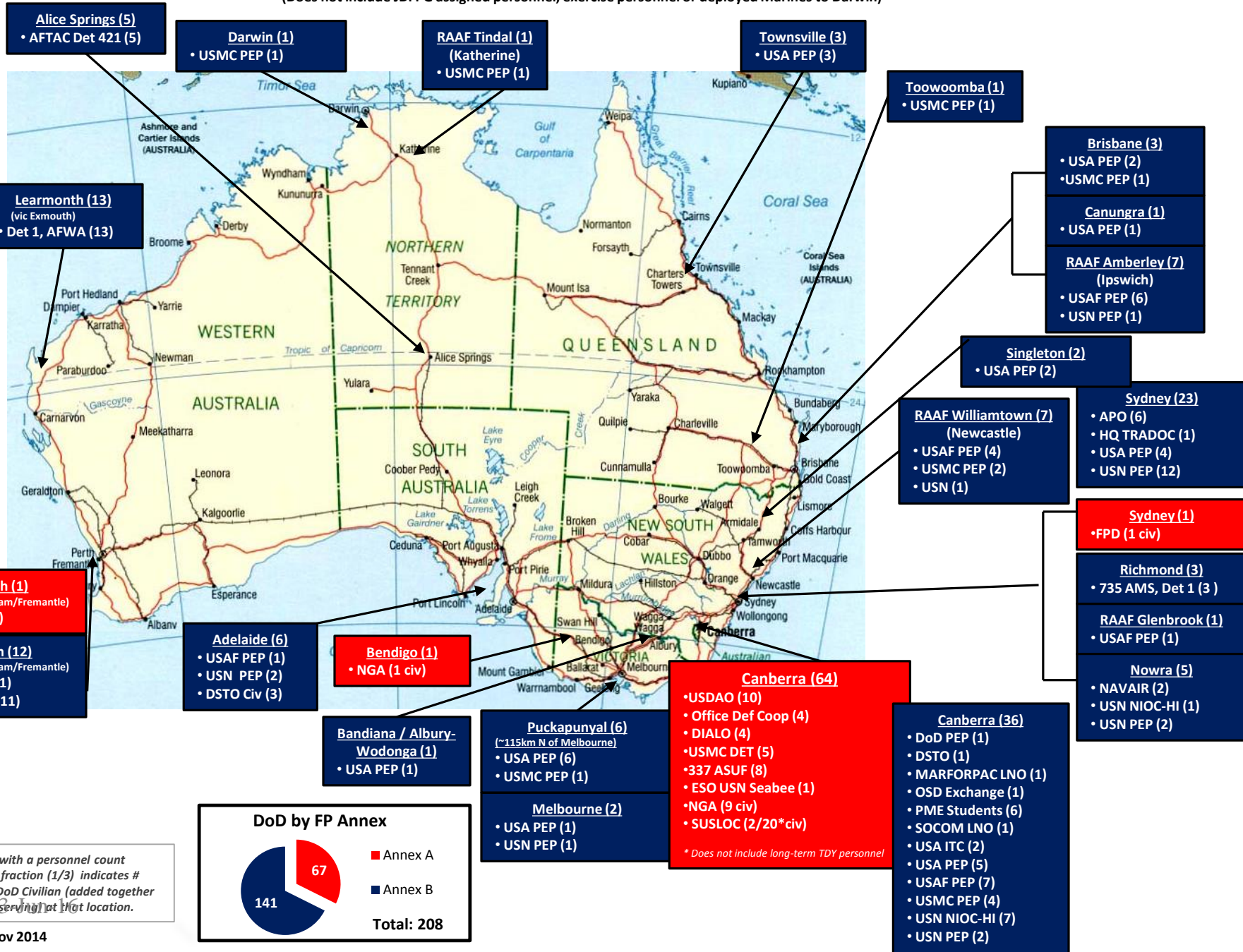
U.S. Department of Defense Personnel – Australia

(Does not include JDFPG assigned personnel, exercise personnel or deployed Marines to Darwin)



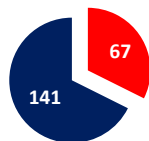

Justice Coordination Points

337th ASUF

- Advised by JA on potential courses

Chief of Mission

- Maintains Authority for FP
- No UCMJ Authority
- Can direct removal from Australia
- Advised by SDO on personnel disposition
- Coordinates w/local police through RSO

Exchange
Officers

Australian Commander

- Exercises TACON
- Can issue minor reprimands (Non UCMJ)
- Can relocate or request termination of individual's tour

Owning Commander

- UCMJ Authority
- Determines Suitability for program Continuance
- Relies on FPD for initial investigation

(U//FOUO) Transiting U.S. Military personnel should contact FPD-Australia concerning reportable situations. Additional information regarding the DoD CI Awareness and reporting Program can be referenced in DoDD 5240.06, May 17, 2011.

(U//FOUO) Terrorism Threat Level: Sep 14: Australian Government raised the terrorism threat in Australia from MEDIUM to HIGH; indicating a terrorist attack is *likely* to occur. Sep 14, PACOM elevated the FPCON for Australia from ALPHA+ to BRAVO. There is no anticipated change of the terrorism threat level or FPCON in the near term. Possible attack scenarios are assessed to likely be of limited sophistication therefore limiting the likelihood of identifying the attack in advance. The terrorism threat is highest in Australia's urban centers.

(U) Recent Incidents:

- (U) Sydney: 11 Feb 15, two Islamic extremists arrested planning attacks on civilians
- (U) Sydney: Dec 14, Islamic extremist armed with a shotgun takes hostages at the Lindt Café, in Sydney's central business district (CBD); two civilians killed
- (U) Melbourne: Oct 14, Islamic extremist seriously injures two police officers with a knife before he was shot and killed
- (U) Sydney: Sep 14, arrest of ISIL followers planning attacks against civilians in the CBD
- (U//FOUO) Reports of threats, harassment, & possible surveillance of Australian Defence Force (ADF) personnel after the announcement of ADF operations targeting ISIL in Iraq.

(U) Recommendations:

- (U//FOUO) FPD-Australia advises that U.S. Military personnel transiting Australia should wear uniforms only while on secure ADF or Australian Government facilities.
- (U//FOUO) Wearing of uniforms while transiting between secure locations or between a secure location and lodging facilities is assessed to be of limited risk. However, U.S. Military personnel should not wear uniforms while frequenting hotel lobbies, cafés, bars, fitness centers, or related facilities.
- (U//FOUO) U.S. Military personnel should limit wear of personnel clothing that identifies their affiliation with the U.S. Military
- (U//FOUO) U.S. Military personnel should not disclose detailed location information or status updates on social network sites.
- (U//FOUO) Strict adherence of OPSEC/COMSEC principles should be followed – do not discuss military affiliation or operations in public.

(U) Counterintelligence Awareness:

(U//FOUO) Australia is a first world country with several major metropolitan cities. There are a large number of foreign diplomatic and commercial establishments, foreign military liaison officers, and a sizable population of third-country nationals. Australia also hosts a number of major events that have a significant international draw. The sizeable U.S. Military presence within Australia is a viable target for foreign intelligence services.

(U) Reportable Situations:

- (U//FOUO) Contact with an individual who is known or suspected of being associated with a foreign diplomatic establishment or a foreign intelligence or security service
- (U//FOUO) Contact with an individual who exhibits excessive knowledge of or undue interest in an individual's duties beyond the normal scope of friendly conversation
- (U//FOUO) Attempts to place personnel under obligation through special treatment, favors, gifts, money, or other means
- (U//FOUO) Queries about military duties, duty station, and nature of access to information
- (U//FOUO) Suspected incidents of surveillance, harassment or threats
- (U//FOUO) Other Suspicious Incidents: Unusual photography, note taking, or sketching of sensitive government/military facilities, personnel or assets

Beddown Requirements

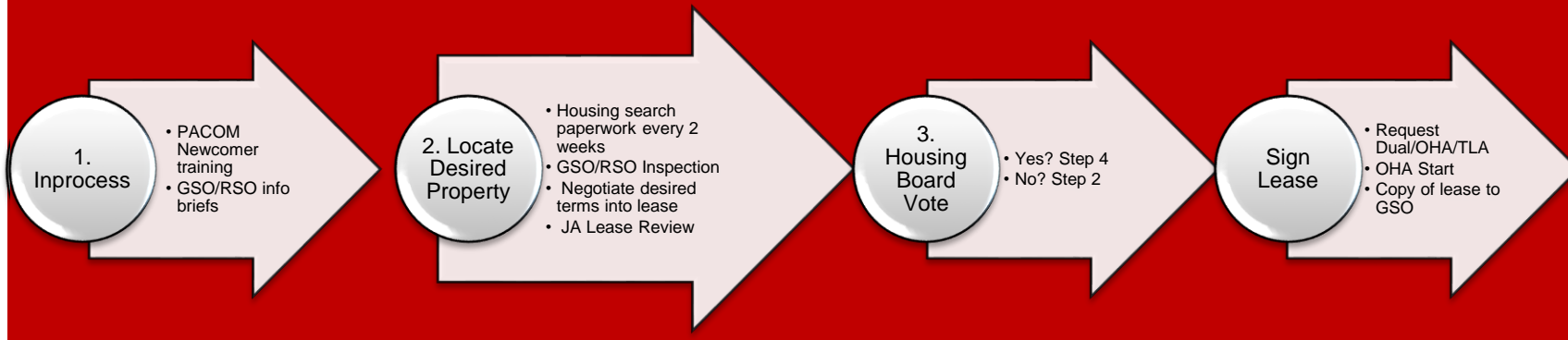
- Ensure you leave your name and contact information with 337th DP

- Housing selection (Annex B)
 - 337th JA Review Lease
 - Self-certify IAW USPACOM FP Directive & OSPB Standards
 - Self-certify safety inspection
- Housing Selection (Annex A)
 - Adds RSO inspection, deletes IATP and Smart Traveler
- DHA Housing
 - Contact sponsor to get ADF ID number
 - Provides housing alternatives w/no inspection requirements

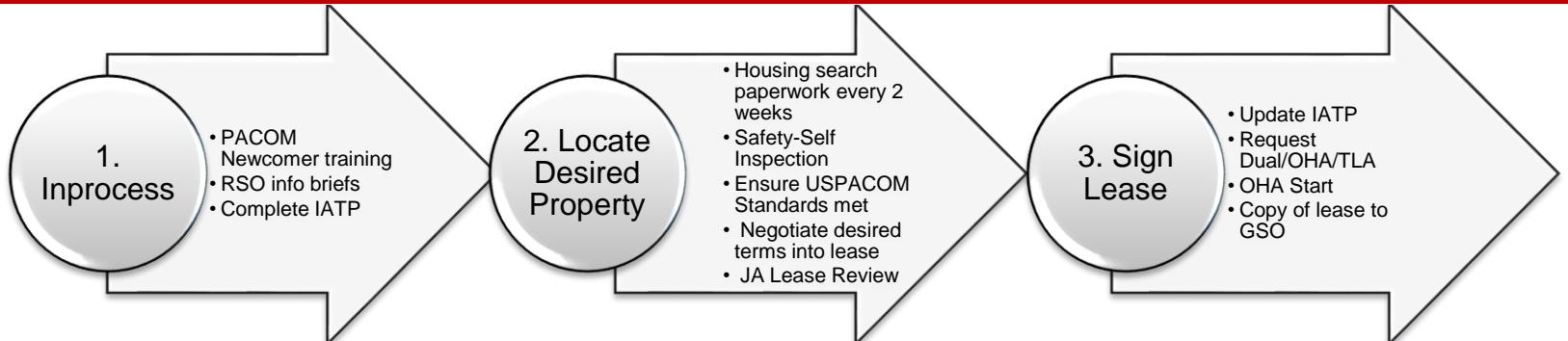

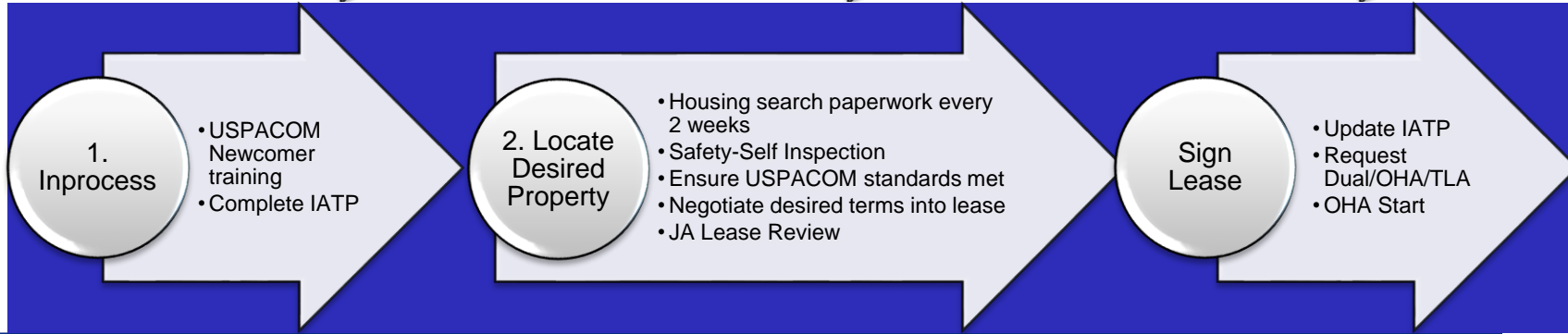
