- Monitor the weather

- · Drink more water than usual
- · Limit outdoor activities on the hottest days
- · Pace yourself when you are outdoors
- Wear and reapply sunblock
- Wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing
- When wearing a facemask, pull it down as needed while keeping a 6ft distance from people
- Never leave children or pets in the car

If your suspect you or your family members are having a heat-related illness, seek medical attention immediately.
